THE BOOK OF MALACHI – AN INTRODUCTION

"For I the LORD do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed." Malachi 3:6

AUTHOR: the prophet Malachi (1:1)

- We have no background information on the prophet other than his name which means "my messenger" (1:1).
- The word "oracle" means "burden" (1:1). God delivered the burden of His heart to His people through His messenger.

AUDIENCE: the restored remnant of Israel who returned to Judea after 70 years of exile in Babylon

- Roughly 150,000 Jews resided in Judah after being freed from captivity.
- The Persians permitted worship of YHWH but the Jews faced relentless opposition from their unbelieving neighbors.
- After Israel returned to the land, they largely resisted idolatry,¹ but allowed their worship to devolve into empty ritualism.

DATE: likely between 460-420BC.

- This postexilic prophet lacks defining a characteristic that assists us in determining an exact date of authorship.
- The "minor prophets" are arranged in chronological order placing Malachi after Haggai (520BC) and Zechariah (520-518BC).
- The issues Malachi addressed regarding temple worship almost certainly occurred after its building completion (516BC).
- Many of the issues addressed by Malachi were prevalent during the ministries of Ezra (458BC) and Nehemiah (445-420BC). This included the corrupt priesthood (Neh. 13:4-9, Mal. 1:6-2:9), marriage to idolaters (Ezra 9:1-15; Mal. 2:10-16), abuse of the less fortunate (Neh. 5:1-13; Mal. 3:5), and withholding tithes from the Lord (Neh. 10:32, 13:10-14; Mal. 3:6-12).

BACKGROUND:

- 605-586_{BC} Judah taken to captivity in 3 waves by Babylon King Nebuchadnezzar; temple destroyed (2 Chron. 36:17-21)
- 539BC King Cyrus of Persia defeated the Babylonian King and took over his vast empire (Dan. 5:30-31)
- 538_{BC} King Cyrus issued a decree freeing Jewish exiles to return to their ancestral home (2 Chron. 36:22, Ezra 1:1)
- 537_{BC} 1st group of 49,897 exiles (Ezra 2:64-65) returned to Jerusalem (Ezra 1-6) led by Zerubbabel, Sheshbazzar, Jeshua
- **536**_{BC} The temple began to be rebuilt until pressure from Samaritan and Persian opponents led Israel to stop working
- $536-520_{BC}$ Spiritual apathy and misplaced priorities led the people to use their freedom to build their own homes.
- 521-486_{BC} –Darius I (Darius the Great) ruled as the 3rd King of the Persian Empire
 Prophets Haggai and Zechariah called the nation to repent of their apathy toward God's call to rebuild the temple.
- 515_{BC} Temple was completed and dedicated in Jerusalem (Ezra 6:16-18)
- 485-464_{BC} Events in Esther took place in Persia recounting God's faithfulness to the Jews who remained there
- 458BC Ezra led a 2nd small wave of a few thousand Jewish exiles out of Babylon and back to Jerusalem (Ezra ch. 7-10)
- 446/444BC Nehemiah returns to Jerusalem with 3rd small group of exiles (Neh. 2:11) and rebuilds the wall (Neh. 6:15).
- 336-323BC Alexander the Great ruled as the king of Macedonia and overthrew the Persian empire

<u>PURPOSE</u>: To call the nation to repent of the empty worship that dishonored God and invoked His covenant curses.

• The Lord desires the nation to be burdened by their sin so they will repent and be ready to receive their Messiah (4:4-6).

¹ According to 2:11 idolatry remained a lingering issue, but it was not the primary source of Israel's disobedience.
