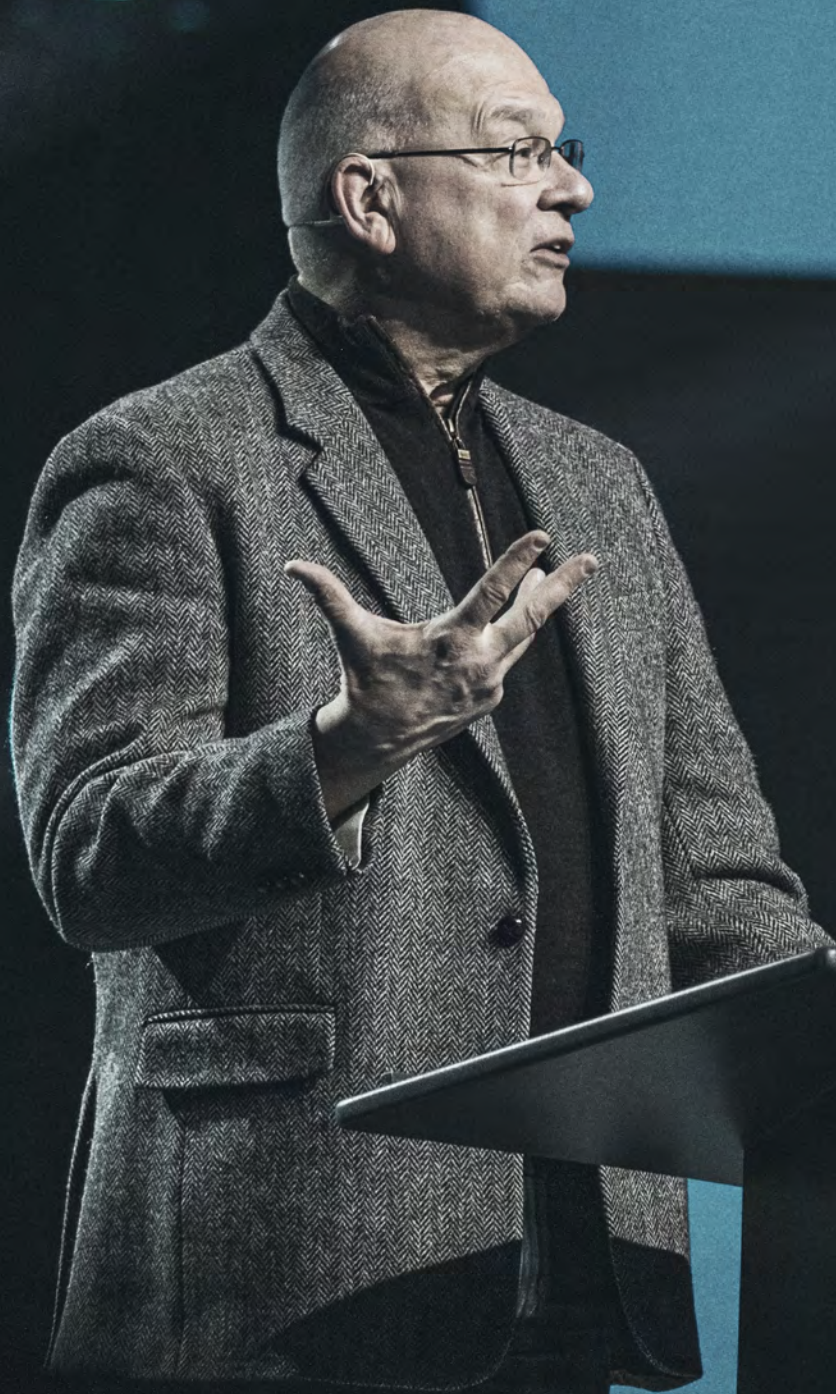

In June 2024, The Gospel Coalition hosted its seventh Women's Conference, ***Behold and Believe: Encountering Jesus as the Great I Am***. More than 9,000 women (our highest attendance in TGC history!) from all over the world gathered for three days of worship, teaching, and fellowship. As we studied the I Am statements of Jesus in the Gospel of John, we contemplated the question of all questions: Who is Jesus?

Our worship leaders Shane & Shane composed a new song specifically for this conference, ***"You Said I Am (Behold and Believe)."*** It was such an incredible experience to study and sing these truths together as we beheld Jesus in the Word. Attendees shared with us their deep gratitude for the refreshment they received. Looking to Jesus, they left with renewed energy and encouragement.

In addition to the keynote sessions, we offered more than 45 breakout sessions on various topics to equip women as they serve in their local churches. All of these sessions, along with the keynotes, are now offered for free on our website. They continue to offer encouragement and equipping opportunities for women all around the world.

As we head into the new year, we're looking forward to celebrating **our 20th anniversary at our National Conference in April 2025**. We are amazed at what God has done and is continuing to do through the fellowship and friendship of all those connected with TGC. We hope to see you there!

# Web Publishing

In 2024, The Gospel Coalition's editorial team continued to deepen our commitment to fostering theological clarity, promoting ministry best practices, and serving the wider church. Our mission as editors is to publish content that glorifies God by spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ as we equip churches and church leaders. This year, we've continued to address the ongoing needs and emerging issues within the church, providing pastors, church leaders, and laypeople with accessible and relevant resources across various formats. From articles to podcasts, books, and training cohorts, we aim to meet the ongoing and emerging needs within the church. Below are some highlights of TGC's editorial efforts over the past year.

We published more than 1,000 articles addressing theological questions, cultural analysis, pastoral advice, and practical wisdom for Christians. With an emphasis on both evergreen topics and urgent cultural issues, our content reaches diverse audiences, from Gen Z to seasoned church leaders. This year, we launched several notable web initiatives:

## TGC Pastors

**A newly designed hub for pastors and church leaders**, offering a comprehensive library of articles, books, podcasts, cohorts, and videos tailored to help them navigate various ministry challenges.

## TGC Best Commentaries

Modeled after Don Carson's *New Testament Commentary Survey*, **this curated list of recommendations** from TGC's Council members and other contributors has quickly become a go-to resource for teachers seeking commentaries at various levels of study.

## TGC Essay Contest for Young Adults

**This annual contest**, now in its third year, invited Gen Z Christians to reflect on God's work in their generation. We received a robust response,

enabling TGC to hear from young adults about challenges such as faith in a secular age.

One of the unexpected delights this year is found in the number of Christians younger than 25 who've been excited to write for us with evident joy in the Lord and commitment to his church. Each year at TGC, we're reminded that God is ever faithful to raise up a new generation of those eager to declare his excellencies "so that a people yet to be created may praise the LORD" (Ps. 102:18).

# Cohorts & Training

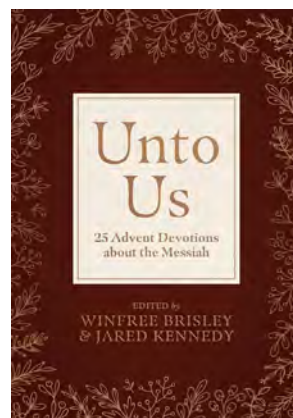
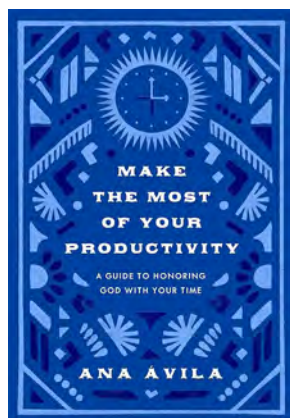
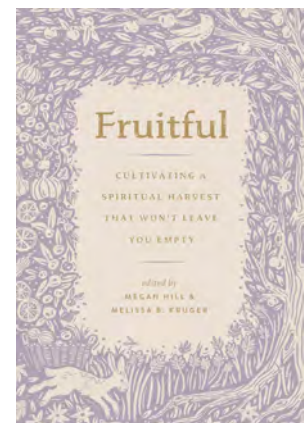
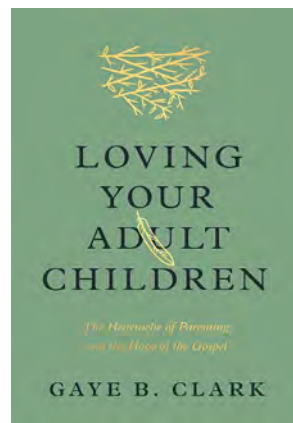
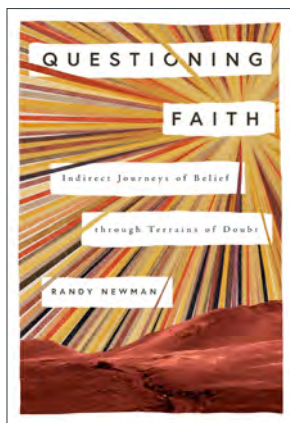
We expanded our **cohort offerings** as we continue to invest in training and equipping church leaders and laypeople alike for the gospel. Brett McCracken led a cohort titled **Navigating Faith and Film**, with plans underway in 2025 for cohorts about writing, pastoral ministry, children's ministry, and others. These cohorts allow us to more deeply engage our core audience with relevant subjects as we support the church.





# Books

In partnership with Crossway and with our independent efforts, we continued publishing books that equip church leaders and laypeople alike. We released eight books this year, spanning subjects like theology, ministry, and Christian living, and we saw continued growth in sales and readership. Our books include the following:



In the new year, we have exciting plans for titles about the call for younger Christians to pursue ministry, meditating on the reality of heaven, considering the implications of technology on Christian discipleship, the problem of evil, and the hope of the resurrection, among others.

# Multimedia



We expanded our multimedia presence in 2024 with new programs and ongoing series that support the broader church, including the following:

## *You're Not Crazy*

**The final season**, cohosted by Ray Ortlund and Sam Allberry, marked 1.6 million all-time downloads, continuing to serve as a foundational resource for ministry leaders.

## *The Everyday Pastor*

**This series cohosted by Ligon Duncan and Matt Smethurst** helps pastors apply biblical principles for day-to-day ministry. Launched in October, this podcast already has more than 400,000 downloads. Episodes have also included conversations with special guests Bryan Chapell and Sinclair Ferguson, with more planned in 2025.

## *Pastor to Pastor*

Featuring members of TGC's Board and Council, **this new video series** asks pastors to reflect on the

joys, lessons, and trials of ministry. Videos from Mark Vroegop, Ryan Kwon, and Garrett Kell are available now, with others from Tony Merida, Jeremy Treat, David Platt, and more being released in 2025.

These are in addition to our continuing podcasts such as **Read the Bible** (9.5 million all-time downloads) and **TGC Podcast** (19 million all-time downloads). We also resumed **Recorded**, exploring the benefits and challenges of youth sports (50,000 downloads) and highlighting the importance of theological content in worship music through our profile of Australia's CityAlight (87,000 downloads). Whether through video or podcasts, we seek to leverage multimedia tools to make much of Christ, encourage weary pastors, and help everyday Christians live faithfully.

# Women's Initiatives

In 2024, by God's grace, TGC Women's Initiatives continued serving and supporting women's ministry leaders and women in the local church globally. We strengthened existing initiatives and began some exciting new ones.

## Cohorts

Being a woman in ministry can feel lonely and challenging. We work to come alongside, resource, and encourage women serving in their local churches through in-person leadership gatherings and interactive online cohorts. Our first 2024 cohort was on **Women's Ministry Leadership**, with both a morning and evening option. More than 445 women from 20 countries participated.

We also long to see women more confident, equipped, and compelled to share the gospel in their daily lives. Our fall cohort, *Sharing the Gospel in Everyday Life*, helped 140 women from 12 countries become more eager to share the beauty of the gospel with those around them.

The women's initiatives cohorts have resourced and equipped almost 2,000 women from 37 countries. Our desire is to

grow that number by creating evergreen on-demand content, allowing women from anywhere in the world to access resources at a time and pace that works best for them.

## Retreat Ready

It can be overwhelming for small churches, church plants, and churches with overworked staff to plan and implement a women's retreat. So we created complete retreat packages that include everything necessary for a fruitful women's retreat. **Retreat Ready** continues to benefit churches around the world. To date, 152 churches (including seven located outside the United States) have purchased one of the four Retreat Ready packages. We hope to create more options in the coming year.

## International Trainings

We have long desired to support our international coalitions and the women they serve. In the fall of 2024, God opened the door for us to partner with TGC Africa and host our first WIT International conference in Nairobi, Kenya. We partnered with local teachers to serve the almost 100 women

who attended the all-day event. Courtney Doctor also traveled to Kisumu, Kenya, to hold a smaller training with eight core women's ministry leaders.

We are excited to continue our international partnerships and look forward to a second event with TGC Australia in fall 2025.

## Bible Studies

We aim to produce Bible studies that are biblically sound and Christ-centered. We are currently working on our fourth Bible study that corresponds to a women's conference—**Turn Your Eyes**, a study on the book of Psalms written by Winfree Brisley and Sharonda Cooper. This study will be released by Crossway prior to the TGCW26 conference and aligns with the keynote teaching sessions.

We will begin working on the Bible study for TGCW28 this summer!

# The Carson Center

The Gospel Coalition **launched** The Carson Center for Theological Renewal on September 26, 2023, to create and curate high-quality evangelical resources for the church, and to cultivate a relationship with gifted scholars from across the globe. By God's grace, we are making progress on all fronts. I began working as The Carson Center's executive director on June 1, 2024. I couldn't be more excited to work for TGC and carry on Don Carson's vision to spread reliable, faithful biblical resources for free around the world.

This year we published articles on Scripture, heaven, biblical theology, the Trinity, Mark, Ephesians, and James. We have a slate of tremendous articles lined up for winter/spring 2025. We added eight new biblical theology essays to our collection: **Covenant and Law** (Brandon Crowe), **Return of the Kingdom** (Stephen Dempster), **Exodus from Egypt** (Michael Morales), **God's People** (Benjamin Gladd), **Exile** (Matt Harmon), **Jesus Christ, High Priest and Mediator** (T. D. Alexander), **Resurrection** (Jeff Brannon), and **Creation and New Creation** (Edward Klink). Our 266 essays are some of the most popular resources housed on

TGC's website, with more than 3.5 million page views annually.

In cohorts, G. K. Beale and I taught **Biblical Theology 101** in the early fall, and J. V. Fesko taught **Doctrine of God 101**. It was evident that students were hungry to plumb the depths of Scripture. The feedback was encouraging—the attendees enjoyed making new connections between the Old and New Testaments and seeing how the connections shed light on Christ's work.

In multimedia we added **The Carson Center Podcast** that circulates Don Carson's past sermons and lectures. These episodes have been downloaded more than 400,000 times.

We published three issues of **Themelios** (49.1, 49.2, 49.3) with more than 375,000 words of editorials, articles, and book reviews. J. V. Fesko has assumed the roles of administrator and managing editor of Themelios, and Brian Tabb now serves as the general editor. The journal garners more than 2 million pageviews a year. Of particular note was Robert Gagnon's critical review of Richard B. Hays and Christopher B. Hays's new book, *The Widening of God's Mercy*.

The Carson Center offers the **Concise Commentary** online, a book-by-book commentary on the Bible. This resource averages about 600,000 page views annually. Crossway is revising the project for print publication, with plans to finish by the end of 2025. Once Crossway completes the Concise Commentary, we will begin translating it into Spanish and Arabic. The Carson Center will continue to offer it for free online to Bible students and teachers around the world.

# The Keller Center for Cultural Apologetics

When we launched The Keller Center for Cultural Apologetics in early 2023, we recognized a new challenge—a big challenge. We're living amid the largest religious transformation in American history. Forty million Americans have left the church in the last 25 years. Many other Western countries have already seen similar declines. The back door of many churches is wide open.

But that's not the only challenge. After the fall of Christendom, believers in Western countries now face a strange mixture of apathy and antagonism toward the gospel. Many of our neighbors view Christianity as yesterday's news but also as the source of today's problems. That's a daunting challenge for anyone working to welcome visitors through our churches' front doors.

Offering vision, direction, and encouragement for church leaders in this new era, we published dozens of longform

articles from our 24 fellows, two new seasons of *Gospelbound* with guests such as David Brooks and Nancy Pearcey, and five new online learning cohorts. In 2024 we more than doubled our cohort participants to more than 1,200 from 41 countries. In addition to hundreds of thousands of readers on our essays, our podcasts were downloaded more than 1 million times.

We are also pleased to announce a new book for 2025, *The Gospel After Christendom: An Introduction to Cultural Apologetics*, published by Zondervan Reflective, written by The Keller Center's fellows, and edited by our staff. Next year we also expect progress on major projects associated with work begun by our namesake, Tim Keller, to engage cultural narratives that resemble aspects of the gospel but ultimately fall short compared to the real thing.

Our 2025 cohorts—including *Cultural Apologetics 101*,

*Sexuality, Singleness, and Marriage*, and *Exploring Neo-Calvinism: Foundations for Cultural Apologetics*—will be available for anyone who wants to grow deeper in his or her faith. Our essays will continue to reflect on challenges and opportunities to share the timeless gospel in timely ways, and help people navigate the complexities of our post-Christendom age.

There is much work to do. But we know God is faithful to build his church. Thank you for beginning this long journey with us. We're grateful to God for countless answered prayers. Above all we ask that you continue to pray that our work will be faithful and fruitful as we equip the next generation of church leaders in evangelism and apologetics. # International

The 18 international partners of The Gospel Coalition represent a worldwide movement within the Reformed tradition that proclaims the life-giving gospel of Jesus Christ. By God's grace, TGC's vision is spreading to every inhabited continent on earth. Here are a few highlights:

- In the Middle and Far East, we support church leaders managing TGC websites in Arabic, Chinese, and Farsi.
- In Spanish- and French-speaking regions, we assist TGC partners Coalición and Evangile21 in training pastors and local church workers.
- In Europe since the end of lockdown, we have held more than 50 gospel-centered conferences in 22 countries.
- In Africa, we assist the 14 TGC Council members in their mission to promote the biblical gospel and to unmask its counterfeits.
- In India, we help local pastors manage the nation's only website with resources in Christ-centered theology.
- In Australia, Brazil, and Canada, we come alongside local leaders as they promote gospel-shaped living in their churches.

Despite the successes, challenges remain:

- Too many people worldwide are still lost and without Christ. Local churches need help in evangelism.
- Too many church leaders are untrained. Pastors need instruction in the gospel and in how to bring it to bear powerfully in their contemporary contexts.
- Too many Christians feel isolated. Believers need opportunities to gather in fellowship with others within their countries and from their regions.

TGC International is seeking to address these challenges: by providing a wealth of theological resources online; by translating key biblical literature into indigenous languages; by sponsoring gospel-centered conferences for worship, fellowship, and teaching; and, increasingly, by building in-person, "on-the-ground" relationships with key pastors and church workers.

Please pray that God will prosper the gospel of Christ globally.

# Regional Chapters

Our polarized and increasingly gospel-hostile culture has made the pastoral role extremely challenging. The number of pastors leaving the ministry (or very discouraged within it) has never been higher. TGC provides tremendous digital content to encourage those in ministry, but TGC Regional Chapters embodies this work locally. These chapters bring the work of TGC down to the ground level and make pastoral encouragement personal.

In our chapters, pastors gather regularly in person to foster a partnership in the gospel through prayer, fellowship, mutual encouragement, study, and collaborative mission. Under the umbrella of The Gospel Coalition and its Foundation Documents, TGC's regional chapters serve as "rallying points" for like-minded churches and as "outposts" for

unaffiliated churches in their area. They provide a place for diverse yet gospel-centered pastors across ethnic, generational, and denominational lines to connect, find resources, and encourage one another. In 2024 we added four new chapters, bringing our total to 23 groups around the country, regularly serving more than 500 pastors.

The need for this personal connection among pastors has never been greater. One chapter leader wrote this:

*One pastor in our chapter is leading his church through an abuse scandal. One recently lost his wife to cancer. Still others juggle pastoral duties while they care for children with special needs, face conflict with elders, grapple with uncertainty over whether their churches will survive*

*financially through the year's end, or are so depressed they're considering throwing in the towel. Pastors need friends. And because of the particular challenges of our vocation, pastors need friends who are fellow pastors. TGC regional chapters cultivate loving friendships where brother-pastors can encourage and sustain one another when ministry adversity inevitably comes.*

In the coming year we hope to expand our network of chapters, working with those who see The Gospel Coalition as a banner to call like-minded pastors into a gospel-centered partnership to foster healthy leaders and life-giving churches.

# Presidential Announcement

The Gospel Coalition is pleased to announce the appointment of Mark Vroegop as the organization's third president. The members of TGC's Council unanimously elected Vroegop on January 10, 2025.

Vroegop, 53, served as the lead pastor of College Park Church in Indianapolis since 2008. With nearly 30 years of experience in pastoral ministry, Vroegop has also been a TGC Council member since 2018 and a Board member since 2023. He lives in Indianapolis with his wife, Sarah. They have three married sons, a college-aged daughter, and two grandchildren.

Vroegop will begin as TGC president in March 2025, taking leadership as the ministry celebrates its 20-year anniversary.

"I deeply love the church of Jesus Christ, and I can't think of a more strategic ministry than The Gospel Coalition to help renew and unify the Bride of Christ," Vroegop said. "For 20 years, TGC has supported ministry leaders and pastors like me through theological clarity, practical applications, meaningful relationships, and intentional gatherings. I'm honored and excited to help lead this vital ministry into its next chapter."

The selection of Vroegop came after the TGC Board appointed a search committee, chaired by Ligon Duncan and including H. B. Charles Jr., Andy Davis, Nancy Guthrie, Ryan Kwon, and Board chairman Juan Sánchez.

"What's most exciting about Mark's appointment is his deep love for the local church and his heart for pastors," Sánchez said. "Having served with longevity in one church, Mark brings pastoral sensitivities and understands how to support and encourage pastors and church leaders in advancing the gospel and glorifying God."



## About Mark Vroegop

**Mark Vroegop** has served in pastoral ministry leadership for nearly 30 years. He graduated from Cedarville University with a BA in communications and earned a master of divinity from Cornerstone Theological Seminary. Since 2008, he has been the lead pastor of College Park Church in Indianapolis, following 11 years as senior pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in Holland, Michigan. An award-winning author, Mark has written four books, including *Dark Clouds*, *Deep Mercy: Discovering the Grace of Lament* and *Waiting Isn't a Waste: The Surprising Comfort of Trusting God in the Uncertainties of Life*. Mark is a frequent conference speaker and served as a Council member of The Gospel Coalition since 2018. He is married to Sarah, and they have three married sons, a college-aged daughter, and two grandchildren.
